My research focused on how Christian constructions of suffering have affected the treatment of people with HIV/AIDS in America. I also discussed the way in which language has been used to shape the perception of HIV/AIDS in both religious and secular communities.

**Future Plans:** After graduation I plan on taking a year off to work closely with the LGBTQ community in the South. I may also have an opportunity to move to Cambodia and work with a non-profit organization that helps impoverished women start their own businesses. Eventually I would like to apply to graduate school and continue my education in religious studies, LGBTQ studies, and possibly sexual health education.
